Baldface Mountain

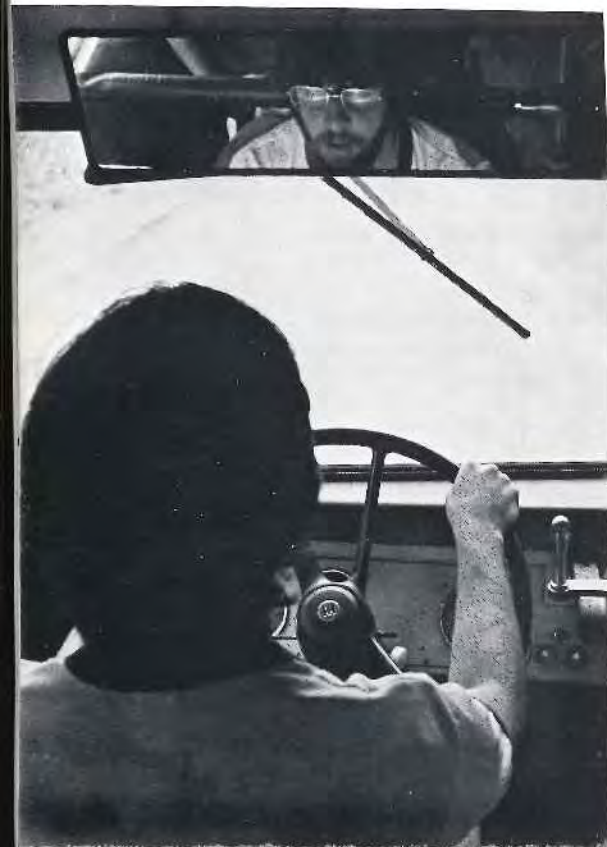

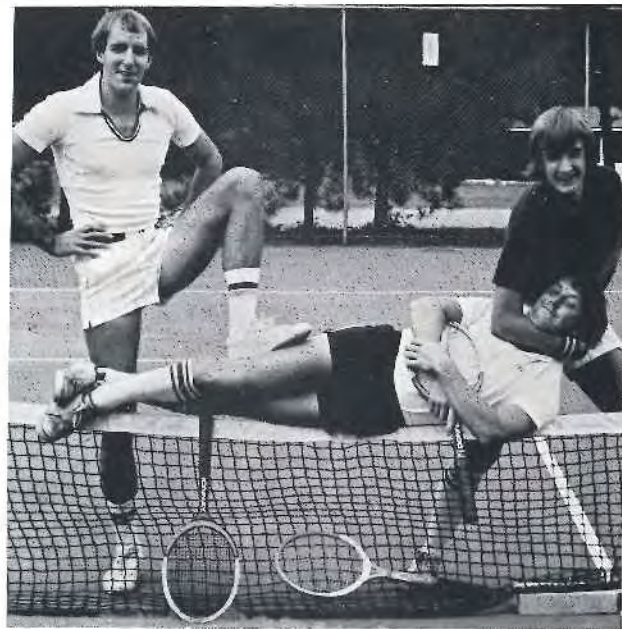
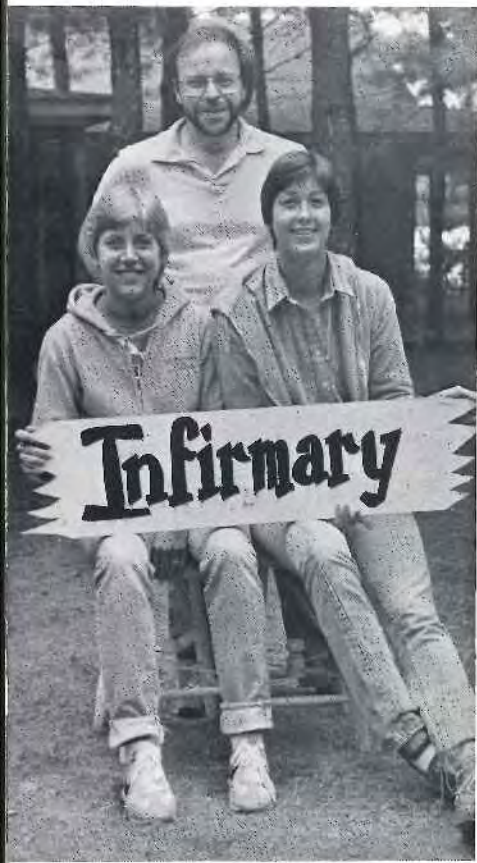

Thanks to all the merry gentlemen skiers for a fun 1981 waterskiing season. Next year can only be better.



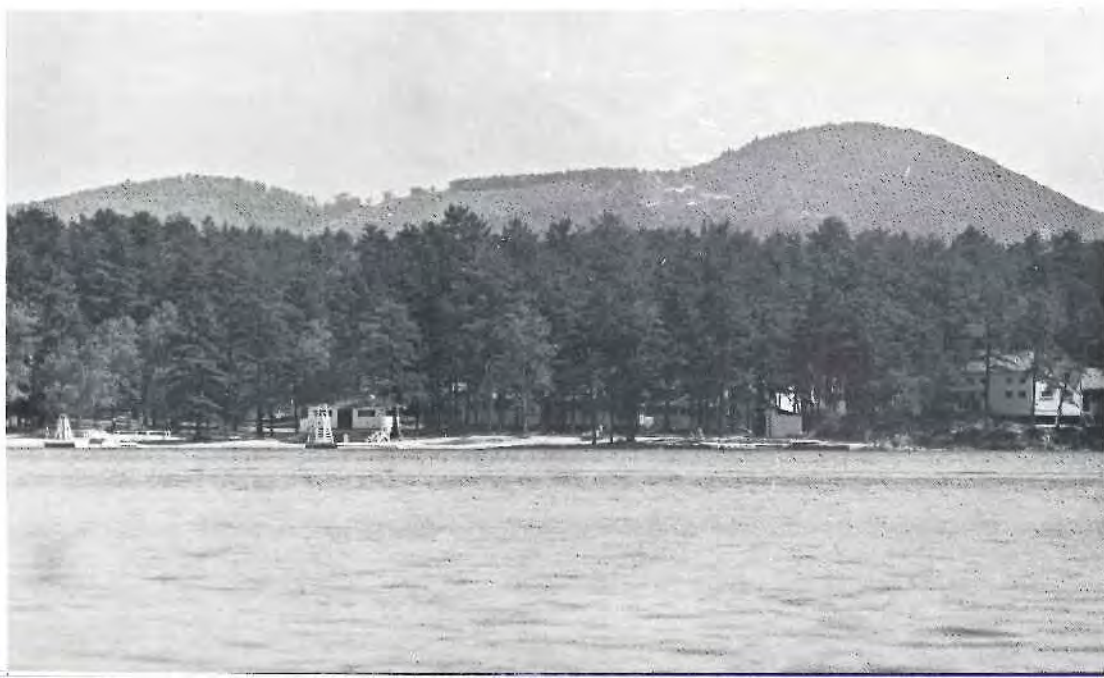
