
Hey, PJ's, did we have a GOOD TIME? You bet we did!! Let's have a look back at just a few of the good times and the special memories that made the summer of '86.

Our 1986 yearbook article would not be complete without a special tribute to a very courageous young man whom we were privileged to have in our group. Ian Miller, we will miss you.










ARCHERY

ARTS & CRAFTS

As soon as camp opened, the craft shop became a busy, busy place with pairs of hands happily making a wide variety of goodies for those special people back home. Copper bowls, trays, dishes, foot stools, tool boxes, note holders, memo recorders, toothbrush and pencil holders, tie and towel racks, medicine cabinets and paper towel holders — all these were the favorite items chosen by the campers. This year we ordered 1/2 inch pine stock which gave a more delicate and aesthetic quality to the smaller projects than the usual 3/4 inch stock. These projects were simple in design and easily made; all were practical. About 150 items of every sort were produced by those who attended. It is hoped that they made a lot of mamas and papas happy.

The Robin Hood craft shop is a large wooden structure reeking with history and tradition and equipped with just about every tool necessary for a busy productive center. Our faithful drill press sometimes behaves a bit sluggishly, but after a long winter's rest will give us more good years of service. This fine tool was acquired during the tenure of the great Roy Bohsen, who helped develop the skills of campers for over thirty years. We were both rookie counsellors back in 1937 - or was it 1938? Our electric saws are excellent, and for the second straight year, no saw blades were broken on the band saw. Our jointer plane is in perfect condition. Our electric sander tires after long use, but after a moment's pause is as good as new. It is still a fine tool, probably better than those being sold today.

During the last two weeks of July, the very personable and honorable Dr. Roland Moskowitz became our interim physician. After being in camp only a few hours, he discovered the craft shop. He attended only after performing his magical healing duties and he worked alone, seeming to prefer to be free of any influence from the craft shop instructor. His work habits became mysterious, almost surreptitious. After a week of blood, sweat and tears, he presented his magnum-opus for my professional critique — I was absolutely astonished! The good doctor had designed and constructed with his own two hands a pencil holder of breathtaking beauty, comparable to the sculptures found in the great museums of Europe! From sources I heretofore considered usually reliable, I learned that the top brass of the Mayo Clinic in Rochester were most anxious to gain sole rights to mass produce this celebrated pencil holder and make them available to every physician throughout the world! Atta way, Doc!!

I would also like to thank Pietro and Michele Gianni of Rome, Italy for my greatest and most pleasurable surprise. It all happened this way. Last year, 1985, after meeting the Gianni brothers, I told them that I had lived in Italy for three years as an artist in residence. I told them how I missed the great food, the fine wines, but how I missed those great Toscani most of all. Toscani are Italian cigars which are absolutely fantastic. This summer, Pietro came to the craft shop with a wide grin and holding two boxes rather large in size. "Here are your Toscani, Hugo!" Think of it, 160 genuine Italian cigars which had left their homeland only the day before! They were just for me and me alone. However, quite a few of the staff suddenly started treating me with renewed respect and a lot of sweet talk.

In closing, I wish to congratulate Justin Weiss for his award for effort and skill and Brian Fahey for his greatest progress award. Also, I wish to express my heartfelt gratitude to each and every Robin Hood camper, for it is they alone who make this Robin Hood Realm an oasis of fun, excitement and learning.

Well, it's 'bye for now and I hope you all had a good summer.
























GREEN & WHITE


DAY 5 - August 7th.







Jason Adler won first place in the 50 meter butterfly and second in the 50M freestyle. Scott Zaldivar was victorious in the backstroke and John Castle placed a strong fourth in the breastroke. Matt Baumoel was the surprise of the team; he swam hard and has the potential to be incredible.

After the Tri-State, the team travelled to Samoset, greedy for revenge and ribbons. The squad was strengthened by the addition of Jon Dolin, Danny Tower and Eric Doppelt. All swimmers swam well in the heats, there were no disqualifications and most swimmers made the finals, indeed, every swimmer in the 15 and under made the finals.

The first final was the ll year Medley Relay - Jimmy Castle (backstroke), Matt Winitzer (breaststroke), Keith Cyrus (butterfly) and Joey Fishman (freestyle) won the consolation final. The 13 year old Medley Relay of Noah Davis, Eric Levy, Josh Moskowitz and Eric Doppelt finished second in the final, all swimming excellently. The 15's Medley Relay of Dolin, Baumoel, Adler and Zaldivar then demolished the opposition from 10 camps in the corresponding event.

John Castle won the 13's freestyle in commanding style and Eric Levy reached new heights in winning the consolation final. Adler and Zaldivar finished 2nd and 3rd respectively in the 15's freestyle in an event where a new meet record was set. Noah Davis swam well to finish 5th in the 13's backstroke final and Dolin came in 5th in the 15's backstroke, an event won comprehensively by Zaldivar. Adler then proceeded to completely wipe out other competitors in winning the 15's butterfly by a long way.



In the final analysis, Robin Hood clearly won the 15's trophy and narrowly missed first place in the 13's. The 11's competed gamely in a strong field, finishing 9th. Overall, Robin Hood came in 3rd, missing 2nd place by 3 points! John Castle won outstanding swimmer in the 13's -- an award extremely well-deserved. Robin Hood swimmers gave disciplined, competitive performances, everyone putting forth maximum effort and these qualities and the results of the meets served to re-establish Robin Hood as one of the forces in camp swimming.


Was there a Forester group this year?

SWIMMING

Safety was the top priority at all waterfront activities. To ensure the campers' safety, they were all checked on their strokes and required to swim sixteen laps. Once the tests were passed, the campers were permitted to don their life preservers and go boating and waterskiing. With the count-off system firmly re-established, all preventive measures were in place. The instruction could begin.

From PJ's to Yeomen, the campers were placed in Red Cross swim classes according to ability. While reviewing previously learned strokes, the campers were being taught the new skills. A great deal of time was spent on stroke instruction to ensure the development of the mechanics and the endurance necessary to swim a quality stroke. Other skills such as diving, treading water and personal safety were included in the course instruction.

Waterpolo was played with a great deal of energy and enthusiasm. Several games, involving both campers and staff, were played throughout the senior camp groups. Passing and dribbling and other offensive and defensive skills were stressed along with sportsmanship. The junior campers began to learn the fundamentals and managed to keep their heads above water.

Competitive clinics were a common occurrence at the waterfront. The clinics were designed to expose all campers to competitive swimming and to ensure their readiness for the Green and White and intercamp swim meets. Freestyle, breast stroke and backstroke starts were taught along with flip turns. Time was spent discussing strategy and rules. The latter proved to be very beneficial in that the campers swam smart races and did not disqualify. The clinics also aided in developing depth for the swim teams. Without this depth the teams would not have been as successful.

This summer the campers participated in a new program, the Waterfront Fitness Awards. The program was based on the obstacle course, run for the past five summers, and the Presidential Physical Fitness Award. Every camper from PJ through Friar participated. They were tested on the obstacle course, sit-ups, push-ups, a twenty-five yard aprint, a ten minute endurance swim and diving. The camper with the highest score in each group earned the award. All scores were taken into consideration in order to establish minimum passing standards. This will enable more than one camper to earn the award in each group in the future. The program had a positive beginning and should continue to prove successful in the future.







Along with all the matches and tournaments there was also a very intense specialty week. All of the twenty-four participants worked hard even though the heat was just as intense as the play on the courts.


















WATERSKIING
