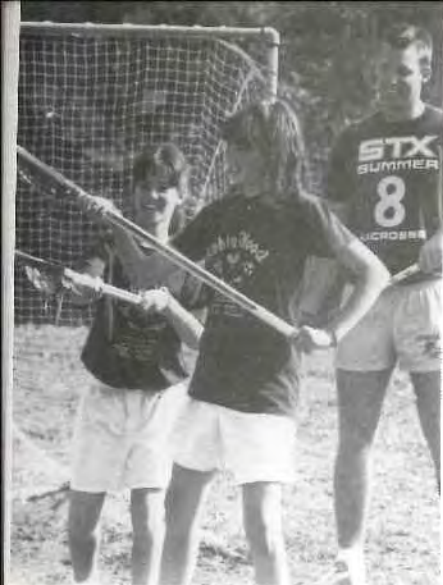

ARCHERY

STEVE MOSS

The archery program this year was designed to be difficult and demanding, a price I was willing to pay to turn Robin Hood archery into an athletic, competitive and challenging program that could be coached and presented to campers at any age level.

We started the season with the presentation to John Klein of a hard-won Junior Olympic Archery Development Charter. In orientation, campers found that the archery range had moved and expanded; we now have a 90-meter range with twelve targets. There were more new recurve composite bows, and we added a new award program, the N.A.A.-J.O.A.D. awards, to the existing C.A.A. program. For the first time we had two archery specialists, with Brian Proski joining Steve Moss at the range.

Last year's Target Intensive became two separate courses, archery and riflery. The Archery Intensive included the video coaching from last year and added sections on relaxation techniques and the elimination of distractions with Steve Moss, power endurance for archery with Abdul Al Mutawa and the highlight of the course, flexibility for archery with Michel George. Mike Brewer, Matt Black, Michael Soltoff, Jimmy Castle, Gregg Whiting, Heather Smith and Francesca Restuccia all passed the course, Sam Chaouki and Michael Rosen passed with Credit, and Ben Brody and Seth Demsey passed with Distinction.

The Second Annual Robin Hood Archery Invitational was a great success. In the 15 & under division, Stefan Friedman (279) shot a camp record in taking second place behind the regional champion from Indian Acres who shot a meet record of 294. The other members of the team were Louis Changchien (245), Dale Murphy (243), Brian Halweil (233), Andy Isaacson (227) and Seth Demsey (217). The team score of 1227 for the top five took second place to Indian Acres (1276). This was a remarkable performance by a very young team in a building stage.

In the 13 & under division, Glenn Plosa (267) shot a meet record and took the gold. The other team members were Josh Guttman (229), Ken LaFreniere (224), Marc Oliver (220), Jack Weiner (215) and Rob Brinberg. The team score of 1155 defeated Indian Acres (1129), Pemigewassett (1128), LanaKila (979), Fernwood (927) and four other teams.

In the 11 & under division, Ben Brody (228) set a meet record and Robin Hood boys took six of the top seven places, with Brandon Barnett (197), Evan Spielman (196), Matt Bronson (188), Shawn Clyman (186) and Pablo Gonzalez (183). The team score of 995 won the division, clinching the Overall Team trophy for Robin Hood, and was the highest score by any 11 & under team that I have ever coached, a far cry from our early season performance at Winaukee.

For the girls, Amanda Murphy (230, 15 & under), Sandi Plosa (191, 4th place, 11 & under), and the youngest player in the tournament, Veronica Erard (169, 11 & under) all shot personal best scores. Heather Smith and Lisa Haralambie also took part.



The highlight of Green and White was in the Lancers, where any of five players could have won. Marc Oliver took the early lead with Louis Changchien and Josh Guttman in hot pursuit, but at the end it was the two captains side by side, the compact Andy Isaacson lobbing his arrows and the towering Jimmy Castle driving them in, matching point for point and shot for shot. Jimmy was never ahead on points, but shot a perfect 30 in the ninth end against Andy's 28 to tie it up, and both shot 27 in the last end to finish with 260. Jimmy took the contest by virtue of a higher number of 10's; however, Andy's performance will long be remembered. He had no shot worse than a red and his score was the highest tournament score by any 12-year-old I have ever coached; I have never seen such intensity, desire and determination on every single shot.

In the Squires/Jesters division, Brandon ("Singing in the Rain") Barnett (206) shot a division record in a blinding rain which wrecked most of the other scores, and then jumped in every single puddle on the field.

A group from Junior Camp went to the Maine State Championships, where Matt Bronson took the silver medal in the boys' 11 & under and Veronica Erard took the gold in the girls' 11 & under. In the C.A.A. award program, Ben Brody and Theo Gangi, both 11 years old, achieved Silver Bow Archer, while in the N.A.A. program, David Zindel became Robin Hood's first Master Archer.

The archery department awards were hotly contested: in Junior Camp, the "Most Improved" was won by 'Shoeless' Shawn Clyman, with Toby Stern close behind. The "Best in Camp" was Matt Bronson, with Brandon Barnett a close contender. In Senior Camp, the "Most Improved" was awarded to Seth Demsey and the "Best in Camp", awarded for effort and skill, was well-deserved by Andy Isaacson.

Stefan Friedman was appointed as the archery team's first captain and the team M.V.P. was Glenn Plosa. David Zindel was elevated to "Freeman of the Forest" for his excellence in archery and his many acts of fellowship. Nick Coslov and Corky Stern were named as honorary members of the team in recognition of their services and David Greenbaum and Toby Stern were added as full team members on the basis of late-season performances.

We approach next summer ready to start a dynasty. There is a logjam of developed talent at every level and a very strong bench. Archery at Robin Hood 1990 will be a sport that all campers will be challenged by and will look forward to participating in.

Now on to a look at our season...

12 & UNDER

The 12 and under team opened the intercamp season with a play day versus Winaukee on June 29th. The venerable Scott "E.T." Elisofon got things rolling by throwing out the first ball. David Greenbaum was on the hill for a team that I frankly had barely met. Doug Lipsky completed our opening day battery. Our infield was made up of Adam Kaminitz at first, Andy Isaacson at second, Matt Wechsler at short and Jeff "Matador" Jablow at third. The outfield was anchored by Mike Deatly in center flanked by Charlie Newman in right and Mark Loewinger in left. Winaukee scored twice in the first and it could have been worse had it not been for an outstanding catch by Charlie Newman to end the inning. We went down in order and things looked bleak when Winaukee scored six times in the second. Once again a defensive gem, this time by Mike Deatly, kept things from getting totally out of hand. Two hours of Eddie Murphy and loud atrocious music brought us to the shores of Fairly Lake and Camp Lanakila. Adam Kaminitz struck out six batters in the first two innings and we took a 2-0 lead on RBI singles by Mike Deatly and Theo Gangi. The Lanakila pitcher tied the game up in the bottom of the third with a two run roundtripper, the first solid hit off of Kaminitz. The blast seemed to light a fire under the Lanakila pitcher as he set down the side in order in our half of the fourth, and then the roof fell in. We got two outs in the fourth before a four foot single gave Lanakila the lead, and before the inning ended we were down 7-2. To the kids credit they came back with two in the fifth, but it was a little too late as the 12 and under season regretfully came to an end. Adam Kaminitz struck out nine batters, Mike Deatly finished with two RBI singles and Jeff "no longer a Matador" Jablow got his first hit ever, so the trip was not a total loss. The biggest disappointment for the kids was the realization that their season was over. For me it was that as well as they had played and as much as they had improved they didn't win. I truly believe that this group will win a lot of games for Robin Hood in the future and I want you kids to know I really enjoyed being your coach. Keep working hard; it will pay off.



13 & UNDER

The 13 and under team was a wonderful group of boys with a lot of talent, so much so that many of them played for both the 13 and 15 and under teams. They played just three games, winning one and losing two. We opened the season at Winaukee, with David Perlmutter on the mound. We started out well as Perlmutter opened the game with a single up the middle, then stole second and went to third on a sacrifice by Rob Brinberg. Ken LaFreniere delivered Perly with a single to give Robin Hood a short-lived 1-0 lead. Winaukee came right back with four runs in the bottom of the first. Winaukee extended the lead to 6-1 in the fifth with his second base hit, for the 6-3 final. Though we lost we knew we didn't have all our guns, so a week later when we replayed Winaukee we had revenge on our minds. While we got off to a shaky start, a 3-0 deficit, we proved our mettle with a big 10-3 victory. Dave Perlmutter was again on the mound and after allowing three of the first four batters to single and score he settled down. In addition the Samoset 14 and Under Tournament was to start the next day and because our 14 and under pitchers were also our 13 and under pitchers we chose not to use them. So we called on our 12 and under ace Adam Kaminitz. Adam was throwing for the first time from 6'6" and was just short, about two innings, of brilliant. We built up an 11-0 lead after three innings, but our opponents from Birchmont finally caught up with Adam, scoring thirteen runs in the last two innings to steal a victory 13-12. Todd Dery and Jon Leebow led the offensive attack, scoring three times each. While we suffered a loss it should go a long way in helping Adam next year as he is expected to be a big part of this team next year.

14 & UNDER

The 14 and under team was strictly a tournament team, put together for the Samoset tournament. It was made up of mostly 13 year olds and three 14 year olds. The tournament was held on July 28th and we traveled to Wildwood for the opening game. It proved to be a very interesting trip with me at the wheel of the van and Markco Greer maneuvering the Citation. For the first time in recent memory we won the opener and advanced to the semis at Samoset. Mike Feiner pitched sensationally in the first game, a comeback 6-4 win. Feiner, Todd Dery, Dave Perlmutter and Josh Lipsky provided the offensive punch, with Perlmutter being credited with the game winning hit. Our ride to Samoset for the semi-final proved to be interesting in more ways than one. First of all we were all quite happy with our big win, but adding to the excitement was a small tornado which we just happened to drive through on the way to Sebago Lake. Despite taking a 1-0 lead we were unable to hold on, dropping out of the tourney with a 5-2 loss to the eventual champs from Samoset. It was a game of 'could have beens' as twice Samoset came up with spectacular defensive plays to end innings with Robin Hood runners on second and third. LaFreniere gained offensive star honors with two hits including an RBI triple. All in all it was a great tournament with a great group of boys which should, with a few exceptions, return again next year, and may just win it all.

TOURNAMENTS

Next on the 'hit' list for the 13's was the West End Iron Man Tournament in Kezar Falls, ME. This five team round robin morning, afternoon and evening 10 hour marathon tournament is tough for a visitor to win since there are no places for visiting teams to stretch out and regroup between games. However, the 13's almost pulled it off! They earned the right to play in the "House" after dinner by defeating Winaco easily 49-19 and losing narrowly to West End 41-47 in morning games. In the afternoon competitions they demolished Skylemar 52-20 and Cedar 45-19. Remember the first class with 7 Jesters operating a very efficient assembly line, one at each station: Photo Timer, Enlarger, Paper Safe, Developer, Stop Bath, Fixer and Wash. It was nice to see so many of the Arrows who brought their own camera to camp. This was a great picture-taking group with Sandi Plosa setting the example by attending frequently, taking good pictures, loading and processing film, making good prints and helping others in the darkroom. Other frequent attendees were Jessica Judelson, Jaime Markowitz and Heather Smith. The more experienced Shires also came with many cameras and great interest in both picture-taking and print-making. Sam Gore, Sandra Jelin and Meegan Smith all experienced the excitement (with occasional moments of frustration) of loading film on a reel in total darkness. What a thrill when they viewed their negatives and found that they had loaded and processed their films properly. Many fine prints were made by the experienced hands of Amanda Murphy and Jackie Pelton. The Squires, like the Jesters, came with a lot of curiosity and desire to learn. It was good to see a familiar face, Doug Squires, in the sea of newcomers. Four of the latter, Shawn Clyman, Richard Gordon, Eric Jacobstein and Matt Leebow quickly became experienced in the darkroom, exposing film, loading it on a reel, processing it and making 5X7 enlargements. Photographs were very popular with the Squires and Josh Edmundson made some very good ones. Richard Gordon spent many hours in the darkroom doing the usual and the unusual, such as making the smallest print (postage-stamp size), making B+W prints from color negatives and making photographs of an ant and of "Batman". The Archers, once again, were in the darkroom more than any other group. Every Archer attended at least once and, as a group, they attended thirteen class periods. Adam Brandon, Matt Finck, Mike Holczer and Jon Kauffman loaded and processed film. Other frequent attendees were Go Fujisaki and Brian Snyder. The Yeomen were also very active in photography. The rest of Senior Camp had periodic but less-frequent photo sessions. Lancers Justin Locke and Alex Marx exposed, loaded and processed film. In addition, Alex made photographs to illustrate his murder mystery stories: toy gun and bullet, bottle and pills, and a dagger. Friars Stefan Friedman and Ken LaFreniere printed many sports negatives of themselves and their friends. Foresters Jeremy Goldberg and Justin Weiss printed negatives from their group's trip to Baxter State Park including the climb up Mt. Katahdin. Justin also organized and led the White Team in G+W. Both teams had a fine



exhibit of prints in all five categories: portrait, group, action, landscape and novelty. The two teams did such a good job that the judges voted an unprecedented tie in points. Saxons Eric Nadler and Doug Spear learned how to load and process film and printed camp negatives as well as their own. 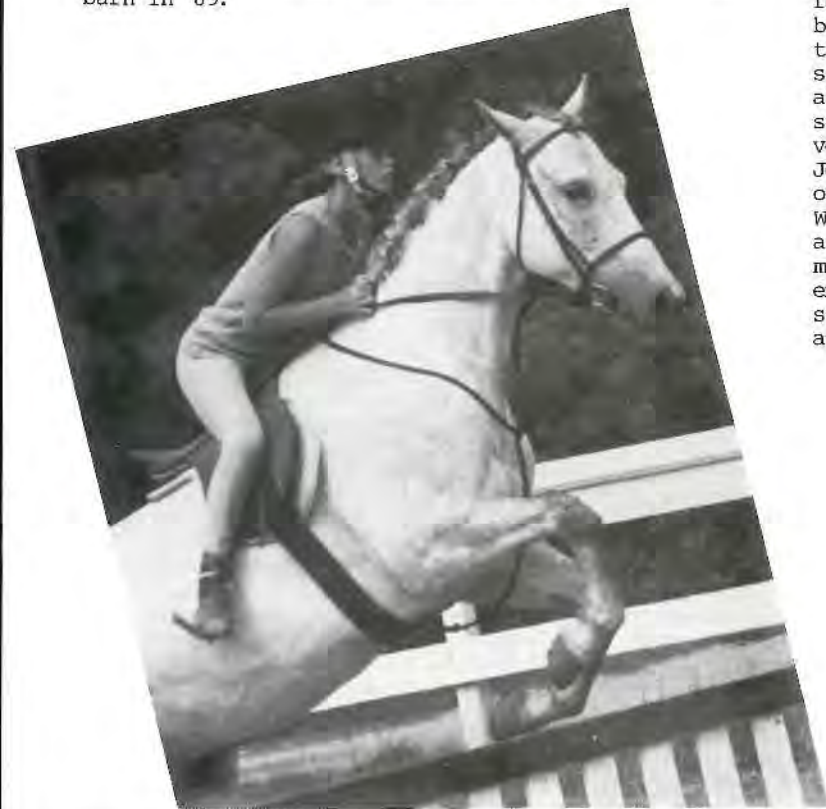

The summer of 1989 again developed into another enthusiastic season for riflery at Sherwood Forest Rifle Range. By the end of the season 35,000 rounds had been fired and 178 shooters had come out to the range to shoot. Over 7,000 targets were submitted for scoring and 66 boys and girls had earned their shooting awards - from Pro-Marksman (PM) through Expert I. Among these 66 shooters, 167 levels of awards were earned.

Twenty-two Juggler/Squires came to riflery many times and learned many new shooting skills. Ten of these earned awards, with the most improved learners, Shawn Clyman and Richard Gordon earning PM through Bar 3 (sitting). The high shooter of the group was Shawn Clyman. Twenty-two Archers came to riflery to learn new and improve on old shooting abilities, with fourteen earning awards. The most improved learner was Albert Cohen earning Bar I (prone) through Bar 4 (sitting). The high average shooter in the group was Evan Spielman. Thirty-two Yeomen participated in riflery with fifteen earning awards. The high shooter of the group was Michael Weinberg. Sixteen Lancers came to riflery to learn newer skills and improve on old abilities, with five earning awards. The most improved was Marc Oliver earning Bar 9 (standing). The high shooters of the group were Jimmy Castle and Marc Oliver shooting 50 out of 50 (perfect scores). Eighteen Friars came to riflery to improve and learn higher shooting abilities, with seven earning awards. Corky Stern, with a lot of hard work and with learning patience, earned Bar 5 through Bar 7 (kneeling) so he could start in the standing position. The most improved young man was Jeff Josephson earning Light Rifle MM and SS with two additional high ratings being 50' Expert and J.O.S.P. Expert I. The high shooter of the group was again J.J. with 96 in (prone), 78 in (kneeling) and 76 in (standing), 250 out of 300. Of the Eleven Foresters who came to the range to shoot, the most improved was Noah Zamansky. Because of his strong desire he earned 50' Expert, while also being the best in the group by shooting 97 in (prone), 95 in (kneeling) and 67 in (standing), 259 out of 300. Of twelve Saxons, when time allowed to shoot, Doug Spear earned MM. This was followed by Michael Reiss earning his third Expert rating in the J.O.S.P. program. Finishing the best in Saxons, Michael also shot a 98 in (prone), 93 in (kneeling) and 79 in (standing), 270 out of 300. Rather fine shooting for a young Saxon!

The girls of Robin Hood also developed a keen interest in shooting. For the Jesters, fourteen young ladies came to learn new and rewarding sport, with five earning awards. The one with the most desire and with a big smile was Amy Whiting, earning PM at the age of 7. The best and most improved was Lisa Haralambie, earning PM through MMLst. Following came nine Arrows to enjoy some free time entertainment. The best and most improved of the young ladies was Erika Halweil, shooting for Bar 2 (sitting). Then twelve Shires also came to improve on their shooting skills, with five earning awards. The most improved was Amanda Murphy earning Bar 1 (prone), followed by Jackie Pelton with Bar 3 (sitting). The best shooter for the Shires was again Jackie.

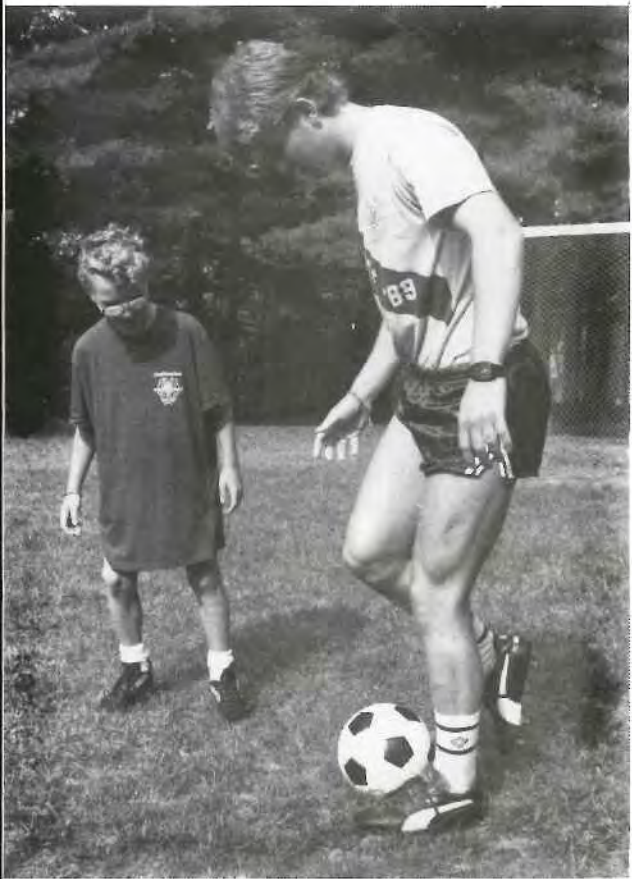

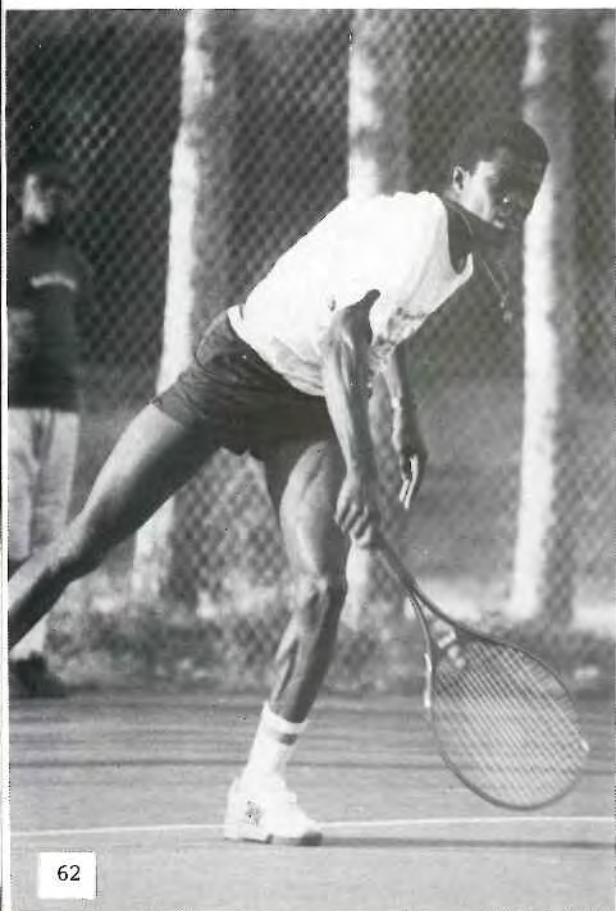
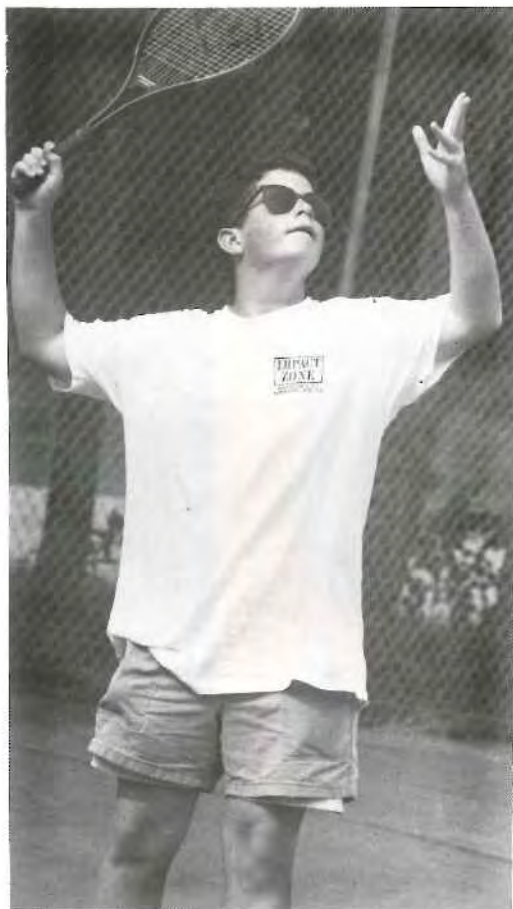
