DRAMATICS

STEVE DUCKHAM & MARK PITT

February 1994 and I finally know my work schedule in England. It enables me to come back to Robin Hood for the whole summer. Mark Pitt and Steve Lawson are also able so the 1993 team is back! On arrival at camp, I found that Steve Lawson had acquired three sets of curtains and was busy putting them up. More equipment arrived including a new sound board, strobe lighting and a smoke effect machine! Our theatre was really taking shape. So, what to do to follow the success of last year and to make the most of our new "toys"?

A few years ago, Mark had done a play called, "The Adventures of a Bear Called Paddington." For this season's first production, he decided to write another version of the story entitled, "Paddington 2, The Simple Bare Necessities". So, over to him and tell you all about it.....

"Paddington 2" was conceived after I had re-read the original script, "The Adventures of a Bear Called Paddington"; a show which marked my inaugural production for Robin Hood in 1991, starring Hayley Butera in the eponymous role. When I re-read the play back in February of 1994, I found that the characters so readily set themselves up to be parodied, they were terribly funny in that they were all so delightfully twee. They all enjoyed magic tricks and cherry cake and managed to sing about such brain-numbing activities whilst seemingly enjoying them - what a delightful load of tosh I thought, let's set about beefing it up! So, during the long nights of the winter, I began writing what was to ultimately become "The Simple Bear Necessities". What I ended up with after three months of laughing uncontrollably at my own jokes was a script that I thought was positively brilliant, in my own blinkered way. I would bore my friends with it, record parts and play them back to myself and laugh even more uncontrollably. I recruited some actor friends to read sections and even voice some of the script onto tape which I had planned to incorporate into the stage-show in the USA - Rick Bear was born, and although purely a figment of my own imagination, I was proud of him. The script complete, I now needed to recruit an actor to play the leading role and I knew just who that would be as I was working on the show -

Scott Gordon has in the past proved his unquestionable versatility as a young performer and so I wrote and offered him the part of the bear before even the final draft was completed, he accepted and thus all was well.

So, I had a show and a leading actor. It was time to risk my reputation! I got to Robin Hood and cast the show almost immediately. Survivors of the original production, Hayley Butera (this time in the role of Judy), Andrew Gralnek (Jonathan) and David Friedman (Henry Brown) were fully prepared to stake their reputations in the play. Supporting them were Jennie Horowitz as Mrs. Brown; newcomer Kerry English as the Brown's certified housekeeper Mrs. Bird; Michael Schwartz as Don Trousers and Carolyn Holland as 'girl in bar', a demanding, mountain of a role.



Supporting them (God bless em') were Jon Posen (potentially the next Culkin) and Dave Goldberg, a young man who makes the cast of 90210 look like homeboys. Woody Trayer supported them and supporting him was his chair. Emma Monk broke free from the chains of the pantry to provide us with a couple of cameos (girl dancing in bar behind girl in bar (deaf, blind, dumb, between 80 and death). The casting was complete.

Rehearsals got underway with the first reading of the script after which my boss, Steve Duckham, offered me some considered advice that would ultimately involve me cutting around 20% of the script - I took his advice to eradicate any chance of the performance lasting more than a couple of days - what I had written was reading at the pace of a snow-plow and seemed to play longer than a Kevin Costner movie. So, with the play now cut to a performable size, we continued to rehearse. As writer and director of the show, I was extremely sensitive as to the style of playing, which essentially had to be British, in British accents, albeit apart from Paddington whom I felt should remain American. Rehearsals passed with me again laughing uncontrollably at the actors and the actors wondering what I was laughing at. The humor was vernacular, albeit the cast seemed to grasp the style. Hayley Butera made me vent the odd spleen and Scott also, Dave and Jen caught the sense of what I had written and subsequently made me weep with laughter. Kerry was proving herself to be adept at playing comedy and I was relishing watching the company bringing to life a script that only a few months previously did not exist. I had high hopes for the 1994 opening production.



The performance of "Padding 2" was an experience which, upon reflection was comparable to being placed naked in a store's display window. The actors were all splendid, they gave a highly professional performance of a script that was proving to be challenging (to say the least) for the audience. They acted their proverbials off for little reward, and my howling at rehearsals was replaced by the token chuckle in performance. It was, I can say, an experience that none of us involved in the show will ever forget - to play comedy to an audience who simply have little understanding of what they are being fed, is not a gratifying experience. But, every one of my cast and crew gave me something of which I am well proud. I thank you, and I am grateful for your work. As a theatre company, we cannot guarantee to please 100% of our audience for 100% of the time. We do have an obligation to entertain, but as a theatre it is important that we produce a diverse range of work at the risk of it not being raved about for the rest of the season. I accept that my writing of this particular show was a tad self-indulgent, a little too close to my own taste and for this I apologize. However, to the anonymous member of staff who after the performance of Steve Duckham's superb "Little Shop of Horrors" said to me "well, that was redemption", I would say this - "Paddington 2" was a production which featured a cast of young actors who gave performances that were undeniably polished, it was coordinated by a team of young technicians who operated superbly a production containing in the region of 70 cues and it was a show which only a few seasons ago simply would not have been possible. "Paddington 2", like it or loathe it, was a showcase production, the children were once again magnificent - redemption for what? Back to Steve as he talks you through our main production of the summer, his brilliant "Little Shop of Horrors".... enjoy the memory!!

EDITOR'S NOTE: The audience was attentive and interested in Paddington 2 - a good indication of a superior performance- Mark's reaction notwithstanding. We are all proud of our ever-growing drama program.

For the main show at the end of the first half of camp, I decided to do "Little Shop Of Horrors". This has always proven to be a favorite with audiences - also a personal one of mine. "Little Shop" calls for a large amount of technical work; and with the improved facilities, we were able to show the theatre at its best. There are also great demands on the cast, so imagine my delight when I found myself surrounded by an enthusiastic band of performers eager to start rehearsals. Heading the cast was newcomer Alex Lees who did an exceptional job as the bumbling shop assistant, Seymour. Sarah Smith was just perfect as Audrey, the girl of his dreams and their duet 'Suddenly Seymour' stopped the show. Mushnik, the shop owner, was in the capable hands of Ari Kandel, and he too shared a great moment with Alex in the song 'Mushnik and Son'. The evil dentist was played with relish by David Greenbaum (his lengthy death scene was another highlight!!) and who will forget Scott Gordon in the cameo role portraying three contractors. His frantic quick changes - including getting in and out of women's clothes! - was a mini production in itself. The Street urchins, who carry the story line through, were played by Anne Loughlin, Jenny Kops and Julie Ritz. They did a great job singing, dancing and acting, remaining on stage for most of the show. Steve Davis also had a couple of supporting roles and the chorus of Derelicts and Customers were Christine Lamb, Carly Neidorf, Kim Frumkin, Seth Lieberman, Stephanie Guerreri and Julia Baumgardner. And what of Audrey II herself? Michael Holczer, on some of the hottest nights of the year, was strapped into the plant and operated it perfectly with only a few days of rehearsal. The terrifying voice was provided by Mark Pitt, who's performance in front of the microphone was just as funny to listen to as it was to watch! He was also responsible for building a great set. Thanks, Mark! I missed you in the last four weeks. Of course, a production of this size would never be possible without a first class backstage crew. Expertly led by stage manager Andrew Gralnek, we had a great team consisting of Josh Morgan, Adam Rothschild, Dan Horowitz and Scott Burk. Josh Weiner, who is usually to be found working backstage, this year became our drummer and did a great job accompanying the show. The standing ovation and wonderful comments that the company received made the whole thing a great experience for all concerned.

On to the last four weeks... the third item in the program was the talent show with a number of varied acts ranging from singing, dancing, lip synching and rap to the demonstration in the Martial Arts! An all rounded entertainment that was great fun for the whole camp. Our last production was a "Treasury of Songs" from the films of Walt Disney. For over sixty years, these songs have become part of everyone's life and a group of singers from all ages performed twenty-one of the best known.

As I said at the beginning of this article, the theatre has really taken shape this year and I can only hope that all of you who enjoy being part of "putting on a show" come back to carry on the good work. It has been a great summer and I thank everyone for making it so. Hope to see you again soon. Love, Stephen

The summer of 1994 produced the highest quality ever of fine shooters at the Sherwood Forest Rifle Range. By the end of the season, 40,000 rounds had been fired and a large section of the camp came out to the range to shoot. Over 7,000 targets were submitted for scoring and 76 boys and 32 girls had earned shooting awards, from Pro-Marksman (PM) through Distinguished Expert. Among these, 297 levels of awards were earned, 4 Experts by Boys and 1 Expert by a Girl.



Of 25 PJ/Squires, all came to riflery to learn new shooting skills and some to improve on past abilities where 15 earned 35 different levels of awards. The most improved learners in the group were Marco Delfino and Michael Squires, both earning up to Bar 3 (sitting). Marco was also awarded the Most Improved in Junior Camp with two others. The high shooter of the group was Michael Squires with a 90, combined with earning the Best in Junior Camp award with another individual. 21 Archers all came to riflery to learn new shooting skills with some to expand on riflery skills already learned, with 17 earning 59 different levels of awards. The most improved learners were Sam Allison and Thomas Gilmore; both earned PM (prone) through Bar 6 (kneeling) and were also awarded the Most Improved in Junior Camp. The high shooters of the group were Thomas Lee with a 50 and Sam Allison with a 164, Sam was also awarded the Best in Junior Camp award. 27 Yeomen came to riflery to learn new and improve on old shooting abilities with 15 earning 41 different levels of awards. The most improved shooters were Josh Edmundson, earning Bar 2 (sitting) through Bar 7 (kneeling), and Jay Klein, Bar 6 (kneeling) through Bar 8 (standing). Jay was also the high shooter of the group with a 94. 24 Lancers also came to riflery to expand on those skills already learned, with 13 earning 38 different levels of awards. The two most improved were Josh Weiner, earning Bar 5 (kneeling) through Bar 9 (standing) and Jarett Kaplus, earning 6 levels of Light Rifle awards and a 50 foot Expert rating. Jarett was also one of three individuals to earn the Most Improved in Senior Camp. The high shooter of the group was also Jarett with a 95. 22 Friars came to riflery to improve on old shooting skills with 8 earning 30 different levels of awards. The most improved shooter was Josh Stein-Sapir who earned 6 levels of Light Rifle awards and a 50 foot Expert rating and was the second of three individuals to earn the Most Improved in Senior Camp award. The high shooters of the group were Josh Bailey and Scott Burk with 87's. 15 Foresters came to riflery to expand and finalize the highest levels of Marksmanship with 6 earning 20 different levels of awards. Toby Stern earned 6 levels of Light Rifle awards and a 50 foot Expert rating and was the third of three individuals to earn the Most Improved in Senior Camp award. To produce the epitome of rifle shooting, Shawn Clyman received the Best in Camp award after shooting a Distinguished Expert rating, the first in 10 years! The highest and best shooters of the group and camp came from three individuals (nicknamed) The A-Team: JJ Ackell, Shawn Clyman and Ari Kandel. They became the foundation for basic teaching of others and producing additional fine shooters. With the teaching abilities they showed, their shooting was also the epitome for others to follow with perfect targets of 50's and 100's several times over. 10 Saxons and 2 Scribes came to riflery to shoot when time was available to have fun - Fernando Alvaran earned PM through Bar 3 (sitting) and Jon Feigenbaum earned Bar 7 (kneeling) and Bar 8 (standing). The high shooters of the group were Albert Cohen and Michael Holczer, both shooting 94's.



Starting with the girls camp, 8 Jesters came to riflery and learned new shooting skills with a lot of fun. Rachel Farrer earned PM through MM1st combined with being the high shooter with a 42. 18 Bows followed the Jesters to expand and improve on higher levels of marksmanship where 11 earned 16 awards. The individual high shooter of the group was Rebecca Strauss with a 95. The highest skill levels obtained by the girls were when 21 Shires came to riflery to develop their marksmanship to a higher level to show the boys - the girls were equally as good. Jennifer Kops earned Bar 3 (sitting) through Bar 9 (standing) and Lisa Rudikoff Bar 2 (sitting) through Expert. Lisa also was awarded the Most Improved in Senior Camp for Girls and also being the first girl to obtain an Expert rating. Lisa also stated next she wishes to beat Shawn Clyman!! Finalizing the awards obtained by both girls, Jennifer and Lisa received the Best in Senior Camp awards for girls. To show the boys, the highest shooters for the girls were Hayley Butera with 94, Jennifer Kops with 179 and Lisa Rudikoff with 95.

TENNIS

We hexagoned. We shadowed. We line drilled. We were all over "Curly" says. We "caught and sweat" and we loved it! We relay raced and we flew. We bent and held and extended and held some more and we remembered... the early contact, the straight lines, the number one rule of tennis, the handcuffed cockroach killers. A lot, dare one say, especially for only the first ten minutes of each period.

It has been said that people come together over sport; that when involved in the activity, all is forgotten, that when not involved in the activity it is missed. Well done, ladies! 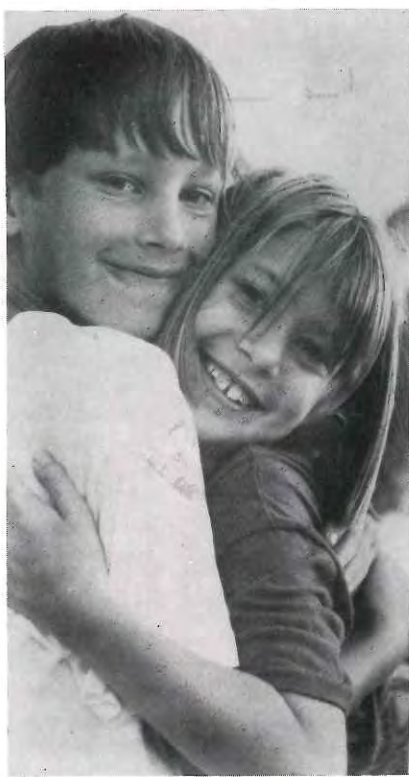
