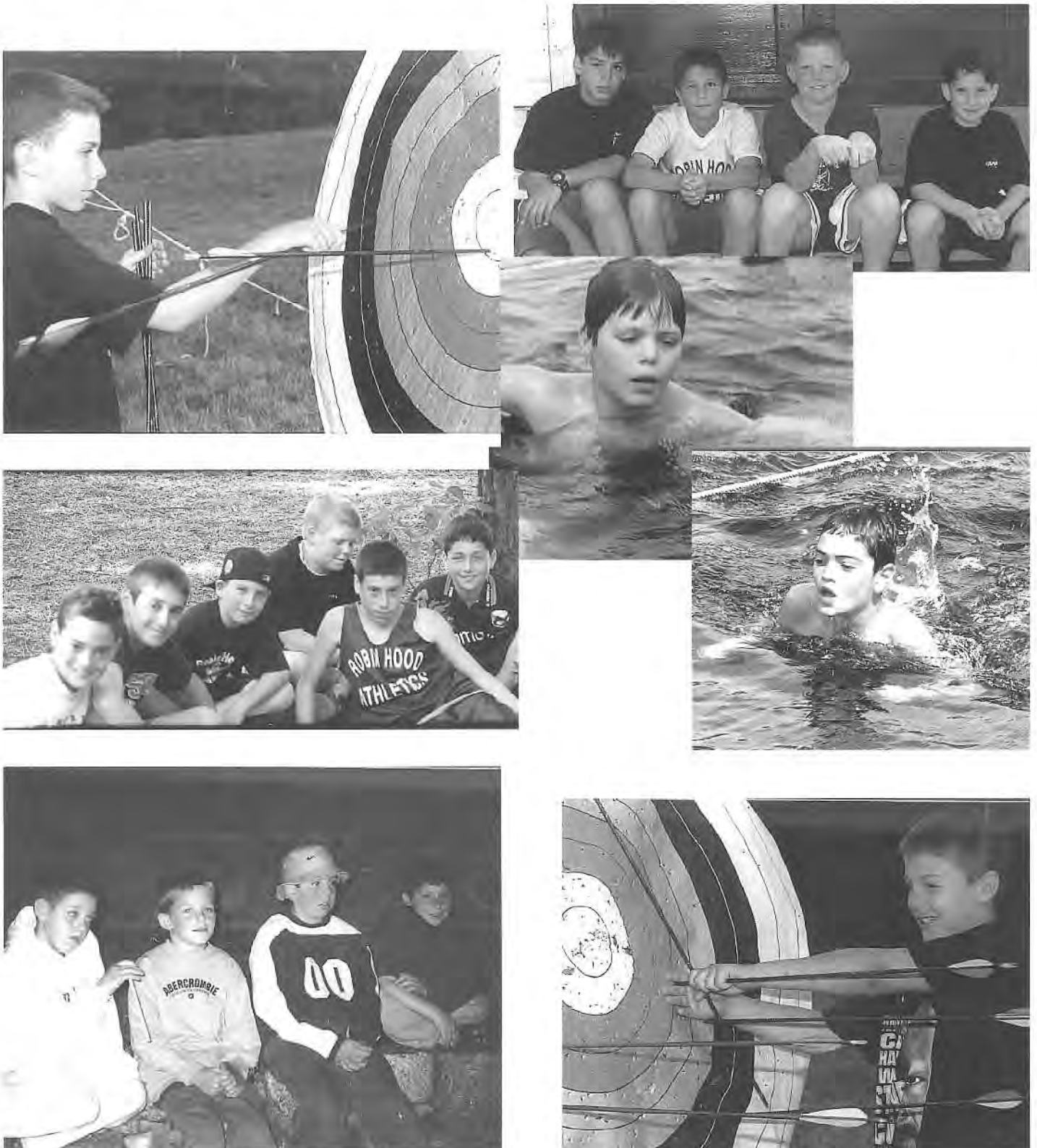
newcomb game ever... the great softball game and countless other events... you all stepped it up and were amazing.

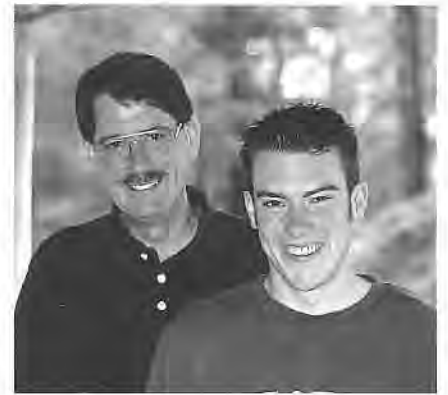

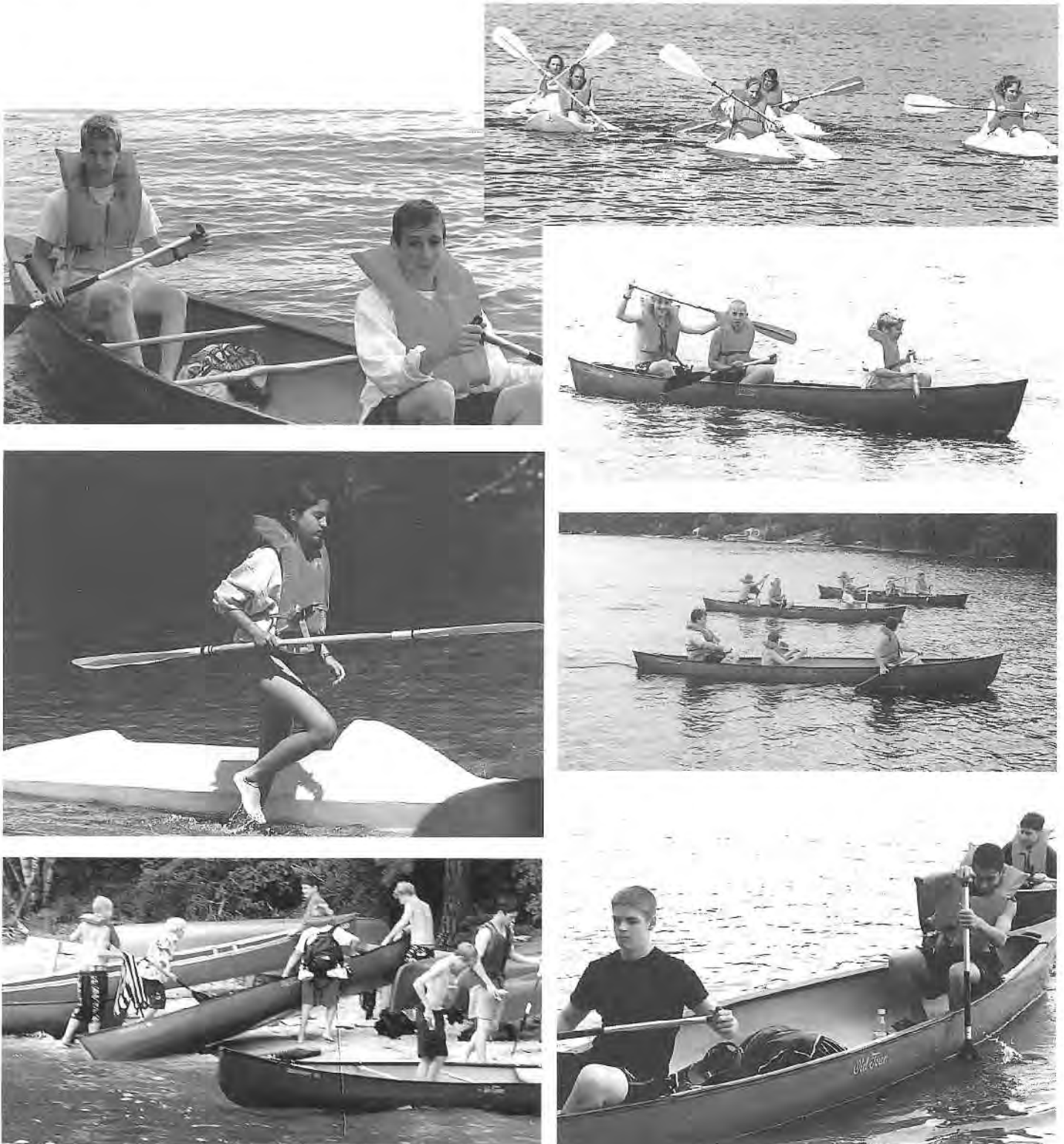


CANOEING

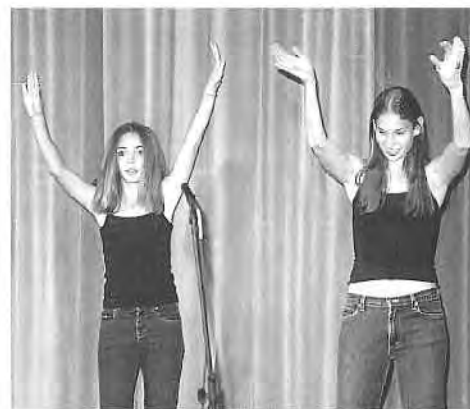
Thank you, Freedom. Sounds like a great time was had by all. Now we head over to modern day Cathay.

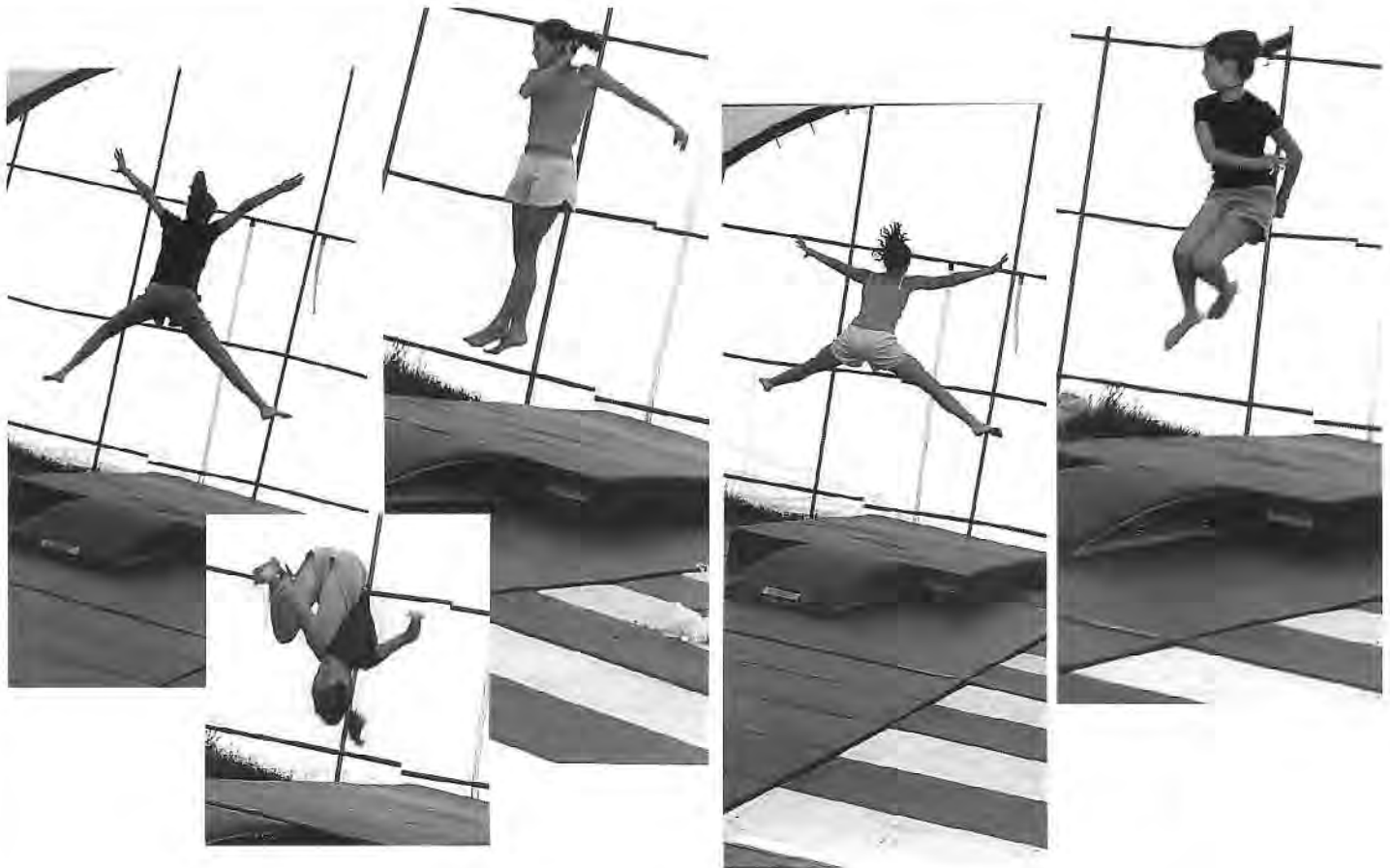

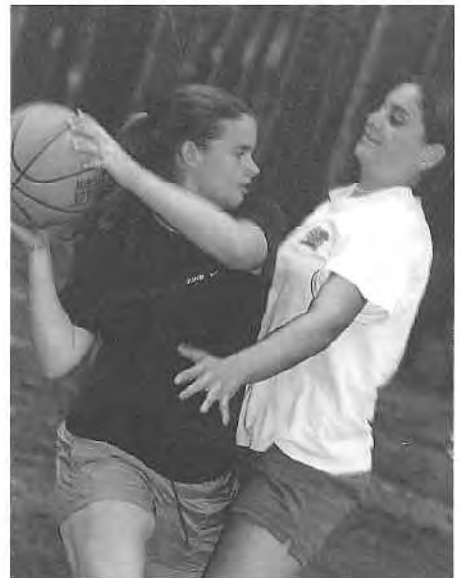

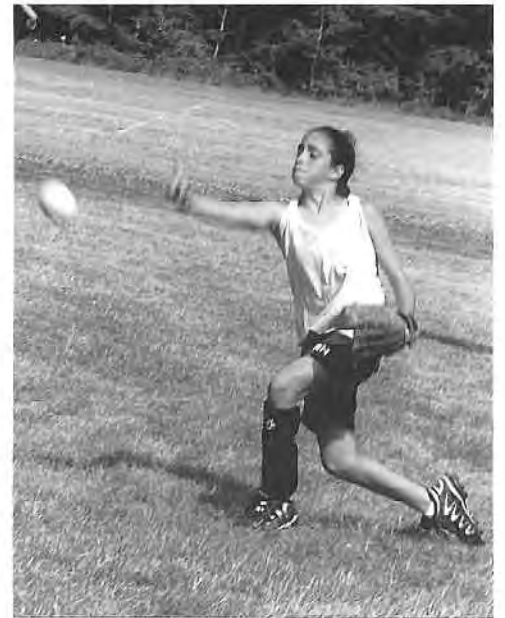

15 & Under Boys

Despite starting the season 0 and 3, Robin Hood turned it around to have a very successful season. With key play from starters Rob Lee, Dan Weinstein, Kyle Cyrus, Stevenson Porter-Bell and Craig Rudikoff, the Hood went on to win the Winaukee tournament while coming second in our home tournament as well as the Indian Acres tournament. Another key to Robin Hood's success in the 2000 season was its bench play. Jeremy Schwarz, Sean Livingston, Duncan Mendelsohn and Jon Meltzer all came off the bench with the same intensity as the starters.

Robin Hood Tournament

Our first tournament of the year was our home tournament and in our first couple of games our play reflected that. Losing our first two games to West End and Wigwam, Robin Hood began to regroup in the third game against Indian Acres with some solid offensive play by both Kyle Cyrus and Dan Weinstein. We then went on to beat Wigwam in the semi's with solid bench play from Jeremy Schwarz and David Morgenstern. The final matched West End against Robin Hood in what proved to be an awesome final. Despite amazing play from both Robert Lee and Stevenson Porter-Bell, the size and quickness of West End House was too much as they went on to win by 12.

Indian Acres

11 & Under Boys

The first tournament the 11 & Under boys went to was Winaukee. I had two practices with the team before the tournament and I was very pleased with the enthusiasm I had seen within the team. There were also some very skilled players who had a good knowledge for the game, which I was also impressed with. When we arrived at Winaukee, we were told that Birchmont was not turning up and that the tournament was Robin Hood vs. four Winaukee teams, with Winaukee also battling each other. Our first game was against Winaukee Silver, which looked to be a good team. Robin Hood played well throughout the game with strong performances from Sam Schulsinger, Chris Kushma and Zandy Bard. We pulled off the win in that game and our record at the end of the day was 2-2. We missed getting into the finals on point difference, which was a disappointment as I thought Robin Hood deserved much more.

Indian Acres

This was a four-team single elimination tournament so it was do or die for the Robin Hood boys. Our match was against the home team, Indian Acres. At the start of the game, Robin Hood played excellent defense forcing the home team to shoot from outside where they were mostly unsuccessful. This helped Robin Hood to jump out to an early 6-point lead from the offensive skills of Zandy Bard. Robin Hood continued to turn the ball over due to good Indian Acres defense and the game was snatched from our grasp right at the end with Robin Hood losing by 4. Zandy Bard had an incredible offensive game with 28 of Robin Hood's 30 points. Chris Kushma had a good rebounding game, and Donny Sagiv and Jack Friedman also played well.

13 & Under Boys

Working with the 13 & Under Robin Hood boys this year was a lot of fun and, as with the 11 & Under team, there was great enthusiasm within the team in the practices before our tournaments. There was lots of excitement leading up to the Robin Hood tournaments both the 15 and 13 & Under boys played. 13 & Under first game was against Wigwam. Both teams started off well but Robin Hood, however, jumped out to the lead showing good offensive skills. Players that helped the offense were Matt Brody, Zandy Bard, and most impressively, Walter Abeson who scored most baskets from offensive rebounds. Wigwam caught up to Robin Hood due to bad defensive rebounding giving Wigwam second and third time opportunities to score. This was Robin Hood's worse point of the game and it continued throughout the tournament. Wigwam won the game due to the poor rebounding but we showed good signs in all other departments. Three words come to mind as to why Robin Hood 13 & Under did not play too well; Green and White, which broke the morning we left. They were too eager to get back and join the fun.

11 & Under Girls

Despite only playing in one tournament, these girls showed great skill and spirit throughout play days and practice. Build-Up – Returning for my third summer at the Realm, I was eager to see how much everyone had improved during my two years away. One thing that hadn't changed was the facilities, so as usual, the fields were painted by hand. Although this resulted in the now traditional bendy lines, we were almost ready to begin. We just needed the grass cutting and some campers. While reading the 1953 yearbook, I read, "The addition of posts and field markings made soccer more official." To help me coach this "official" game were Matt, a typical 6'6" English centre forward and Lisa, not a typical centre forward but a skillful player proving how strong the women's game is in America.

First Half – In camp, we did passing, shooting and heading drills. Why do all the general counselors sit out when we do heading? All the boys wanted to play was World Cup and the girls... "Can we play head-catch, please?" In between these, we also played "steal the bacon", "knockout", had dribbling relays and played the penalty area game. Most sessions finished off with a full game or scrimmage, but remember, "Let the kids play!"

In boy's camp, the PJ Squires and Archers both were defeated in play days, despite having some very talented soccer players. The Yeomen didn't do much soccer and lost 7-0 in a play day despite the superb performance of Andrew Cohen in goal. They also finished one session with a game against the Bards and Shires, which was the best I've seen them play all summer. The Foresters were not the most skillful group in camp but produced some exciting games during their sessions (Holczer, keep practicing, you might make it one day!). The Saxons play day game ended in a 1-1 defeat despite Fernando Madrazo's and Mike Aquino's efforts.

The number of campers who signed up for soccer Intensive Week was encouraging. Here, we did more technical work on running off the ball, defending and set pieces. The inter-camp teams had mixed results over the summer. The highlight for all the soccer staff was the **11 & Under girls**. For the first time in my three years at Robin Hood, I had about 14 players who could all play very well. This made team selection extremely difficult. The girls warmed up for their tournament with a friendly game against the 11 & Under boys (themselves a very strong team). The tournament here at the Realm saw us in a group with Waukeela and Forest Acres. We beat Waukeela 5-0 thanks to goals from Dana Geldwert, Mackenzie Davis, Alyssa Blood and two from Lauren Tuck. Against Forest Acres, two more goals from Dayna and one from Alyssa gave us a 3-0 victory and a semi-final place. In this game against Birchmont Alyssa, Lauren, Annie Crane, Sara Kushma and Mackenzie scored along with Anna Wiggin who came out of goal to convert a penalty. Even though they were 7-0 up, the girls' elation at reaching the final was something that will stay with me for a long time. As we waited for the thunder and lightening to clear for the final, we sat in the grandstand singing songs about frogs. Despite the girls' efforts, they went down 2-0 to Evergreen but were well deserving of their runner's up trophy. Everyone who played was awesome, in particular Sara Kushma's holding midfield role and Kelsey Sheehan and Annie Crane whose understanding of offside and controlling of the defense were the best I've seen in all teams at Robin Hood over three summers. They were also well supported by Isabella Siblesz and Kate Smith-Peterson.

The **11 & Under** boys in their first tournament also finished runners-up. In their semi-final, they showed great heart to come back from 1-0 down. Then, goals coming from Moose, Matt Rosen and Daniel Grossman gave us a 3-1 victory over Winaukee. In the finals, a very large Tecumseh team overcame the strong Robin Hood defense to run out 5-0 winners. Taylor Lesser was superb in goal, Donny, Jack and Kushma were passing superbly, and Zack, Myles, Ryan, Jonathon and Chris were strong despite the Tecumseh pressure.

The **13 & Under** girls had a game against Waukeela. I had the great idea of playing Sam Berschler three times on the team sheet. Then, with 11 different players, the girls played superbly, particularly Libby in goal and Sam, Kelsey and Brett in the field. The game was tied at 1-1 before Lauren Tuck scored the winner to give us a deserved 2-1 victory.

The **13 & Under** boys were never going to be the strongest team as a lot of the players were only 11 or 12. In the Robin Hood tournament, we lost our first game 5-0 to West End. In the





second half, Robin Hood showed more spirit to keep the score down. Our second game against Winaukee was much closer and we played like a team that needed to win. Scott Heller was excellent in goal, as was Ben Jelin in defense. Unfortunately, a mistake in defense led to Winaukee scoring the only goal and eliminating us. This team also played against Twyford School, our visitors from England. Despite going a goal down early on, we battled back to equalize. Then, a combination of individual mistakes and a lack of commitment led to Twyford taking a 5-1 lead into the second half. To even up the game and give the 14 & Under some practice, we played four 14 year olds in the second half. This seemed to encourage the 13-year-olds and Tomasso Fassati and Scott Schwartz produced their best display so far. Stephenson Porter-Bell's power and speed lead to two quick goals, which left the game at 5-3. The English children then lifted their game to take control again and Robin Hood heads went down. The game finished 11-3 in Twyford's favor. The 13 & Under boys also had a tournament a few days later at Winaukee. Instead of "Lakes Region" it was accurately described over the P.A. as "Pond" Region tournament, as there was only Winaukee and us. Again, the team played below their full potential and was 4-0 down at half time. A more passionate second half performance left the final score 6-1, or you could say we finished runners-up in the Lakes Region.

The 14 & Under boys had a tournament at Tecumseh and played the host in the semi-final. A 6-0 defeat didn't reflect the team's performance. The 3rd/4th-place game against Winaukee was a joy to watch. Cohen and Crane were awesome. Livingston and Brody scored 3 each; Stevenson scored one and entertained the crowd with his trickery. The match ended with a 7-2 RH victory and the team's spirit and determination was a credit to the camp. The other results suggested that we were the second best team in the tournament but were unfortunate to play Tecumseh first.

The 15 & Under boys were mainly the same team but with two, older players. After a 6-0 defeat to Tecumseh, we produced a battling performance to beat Camp Lawrence 1-0 and advance to the semi-finals, through Sean Livingston's strike. We passed the ball around superbly at times but went to sleep in-between. This allowed a Winaukee team, that wasn't really better than us, a 6-2 win. In the 3rd/4th-place game, we again made it difficult for ourselves by going 2-0 down. Almost the entire second half was played in the Maine Teen half and despite a brilliant passing move to score, many other chances were saved, went wide, or hit the goal posts to end in a 2-1 defeat. Mike Aquino, Jeremy Schwarz, Emre Kennedy and Andrew Arnot were all excellent, as was Mark Crane who seemed to play better with the older age groups than with the 13 or 14 & Under teams.

The 16 & Under girls played Maine Teen and after going 1-0 down, equalized to silence the Maine Teen band. Despite good performances from Lisbeth Balligan, Emily Geldwert, Natasha Berney and Brett Jeffries, Maine Teen finished up 3-1 winners.



Half Time – Parent's Weekend: parents and campers participated enthusiastically, with many parents eager to show that this "soccer" game was really quite simple. In the Bows group, Audrey Lee's father accidentally knocked over his youngest daughter while going for the ball. He then picked her up, asked mum to see to her, and chased after the ball. The campers began fighting back when Sam Berschler kicked the ball in a very painful area for someone's granddad. Most sessions finished with a full game including parents. The Lancers set the record for the biggest game at Robin Hood with 23 a side. The game had to be delayed while a member of the riding staff cleared the debris from the horse show off the field. After Parent's Weekend, the staff had a co-ed game. Britain versus the rest of the World. After going 1-0, the British got going to run out 5-1 winners.

Second Half – Peter Corbin took over the programming and managed to schedule four groups at the same time, it was also Matt's day off! Although the intercamp games finished, soccer continued in camp, until Green and White broke. Matt and I had hoped to be on opposite teams to pit our coaching skills against each other, instead, we had to settle to forming a dream team for the male staff game, while Lisa had the difficult task of beating the English at her own game. The first day went Green's way with Bows/Quills winning 1-0 and the Green Lancers winning a great game 3-2 after going 2-0 up, White pulled back to 2-2 before Simon Peter, the only English player on the field, scored a superb solo goal to give Green the points. The male staff game was played in the pouring rain. The more skillful Green overcame the physical and aggressive White 2-1, with goals from Matt and Grant. The female staff game was probably better to watch and was an excellent team performance from Green. Despite the whole of the second half being played around the White's penalty area, Lisa's goal in the first half gave White the points. Apart from the setback, the majority of the game went Green's way. Friars 4-0, Yeomen 3-0, Fo/Sax 2-0, Archers 6-1. PHOTOGRAPHY

We were in luck because we had PJ Squire Counselor Robyn Heller to take over the department for the remaining weeks, which included the Green and White competition. Liz and I felt good about Robyn teaching photography because we witnessed his skill and knowledge during the summers of 1997 and 1998 which earned him the Photography Award for Boys for Effort and Skill (Best In Camp) for both years.

The girls were far more active in photography than the boys. The **Tumblers** came with enthusiasm and wonder, each wanting to be first in getting a camera and a roll of film. They traveled around the camp with a counselor and tried to get a wide variety of pictures in five categories: action, group, portrait, landscape and novelty. After film exposure they learned how to process the film and print the negatives. The most active participants, who also worked well as a darkroom team, were Melissa Bromberg, Jessica Fisher, Allison Howard and Sofia Madrazo. The **Jesters** were even more enthusiastic about photography than the Tumblers. They had a 100% group attendance and they attended very often. They attended not only during scheduled class times but also during open rest hours. They learned the four steps in the photographic process: expose film (with camera), process film (with tank), expose paper (with enlarger), and process paper (with trays). The hardest step is film processing because exposed film must be removed from its light tight cassette, threaded onto a processing reel and placed in a light tight processing tank in total darkness without a safelight. Very few young campers can do this step without counselor assistance. What a surprise it was to be with Sarah Szewczyk when she accomplished this feat without needing any assistance from me. Other active participants were Dana Berschler, Becca Brodoff, Michelle Brush, Jessica Francis, Lexie Herman, Audrey Lee, Lily Miesmer and Lily Nathanson.

The **Quills** were not only good at writing with pens but also writing with light (photography). They came frequently to borrow cameras to take pictures and to use the darkroom to process the film and print enlargements. This group contained a lot of photographic winners: Alison Chemla received the Photography Award for Girls for Effort and Skill (Best in Camp) for the second year in a row, Natalie Haimo earned the Photography Award for Girls for Progress and Achievement (Most Improved), and Katherine "KK" Hanna worked long and hard at improving her photographic proficiency for which she received an Honorable Mention. 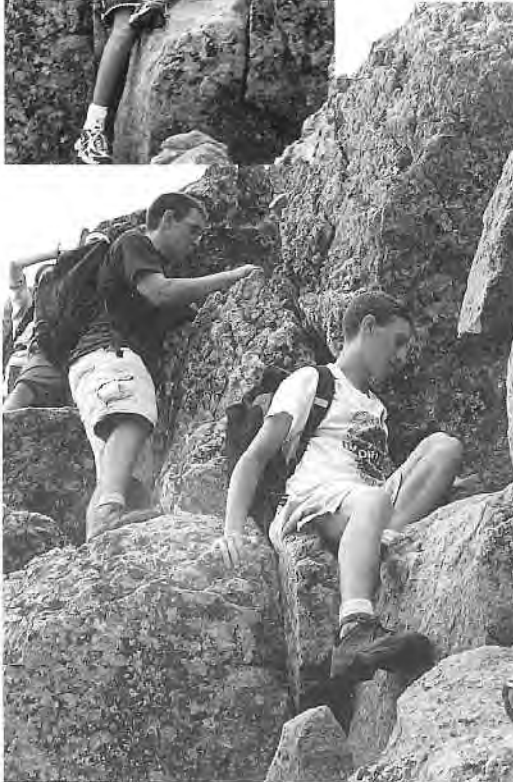

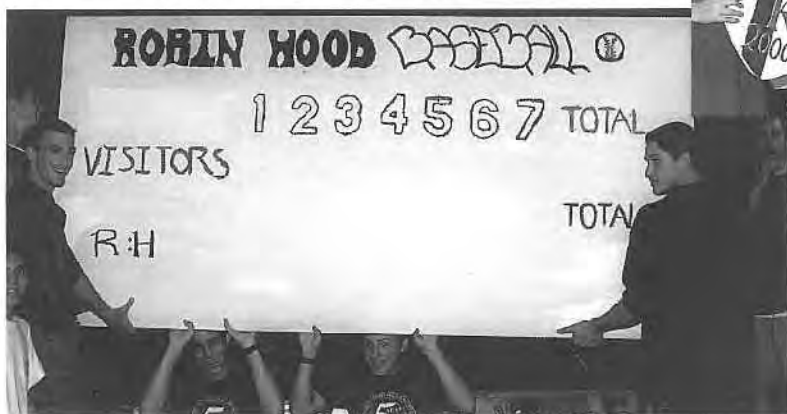

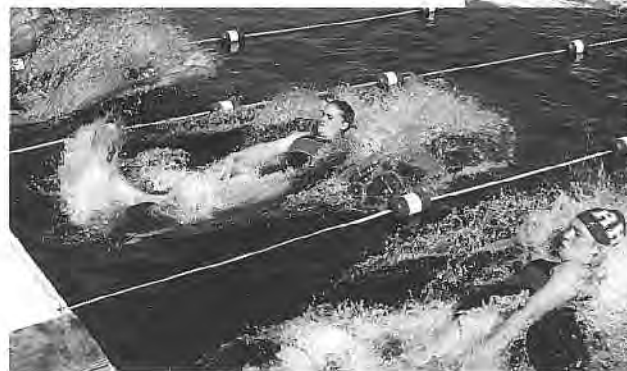
